Once registered you can make an appointment to use the shelf and choose your items (similar to a grocery store). Each household can visit 12 times per year (July 1-June 30) for standard food assistance, plus once/week for ECHO Extras (fresh produce & baked goods). Walk-ins always welcome.

### **SNAP (Minnesota Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)**

Formerly Food Stamps. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is a county-run, state-supervised Federal program that helps Minnesotans with low incomes get the food they need for sound nutrition and well-balanced meals. The program issues electronic food support benefits that can help stretch your household food budget. Eligibility depends on household income.

Your SNAP benefit will vary based on your income and expenses. Your county will determine your benefit amount. Your SNAP benefit is issued monthly on an Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card that is used like a credit card to purchase food at participating stores.
