## Please check in at the Diagnostic Imaging Department.

The Mankato Clinic is requiring masking only for patients over the age of 2 that are feeling ill. If you are unable to keep your appointment or have questions, please call (507) 389-8570.

#### What is a CT Pelvis without Contrast:

This test is a specialized x-ray of your organs located between the hips and bottom of your pelvis.

### How do I prepare for the test:

- Before scheduling your test, please tell your provider if you are pregnant or think you may be pregnant.
- Continue to take your normal medications.
- Two days before your test, the radiologist will review if the test ordered is appropriate for your condition. In order to provide the best test with lowest radiation, there is a chance the radiologist may modify your test. This may involve a need to adjust your prep and/or arrival time. A technologist would contact you by phone to discuss any changes.
- It is important that you drink a variety of fluids to prevent dehydration.
- There are no dietary restrictions for this test.
- If you wear a glucose monitor, you will be required to remove it prior to your scan for your own safety. If appropriate, you may request to have your scan scheduled to coordinate with the next replacement date of your monitor.
- To provide the best service and ensure your safety, young unsupervised children should not accompany parents to their imaging appointments. Safety practices limit the number of people in the testing room and young children are not to be left unsupervised while in the waiting room or lobby. This will also ensure you can relax during the test which will result in better image outcomes.
- We recommend that you contact your insurance company prior to your appointment to understand what your coverage is for this test.

### What will happen during the test:

- You may be asked to arrive in Diagnostic Imaging one hour before your scan time in order to receive the oral contrast required by the Radiologist for your test.
- The CT scanner is a large machine that is shaped like a donut.
- You will be asked to undress and to remove any jewelry and/or piercings from this area. A gown will be provided.
- You will be asked to lie on your back on the scanning table with your arms placed above your head.
- Your test will take approximately 20 minutes once you are in the scan room.

## Instructions for after your test:

- You may experience some diarrhea for the remainder of the day, if you were given oral contrast to drink.
- Your test will be reviewed and reported by a Radiologist within the next 24 hours.
- The final signed report will be sent to the provider that ordered your test.
- Your test results will be available in your patient portal immediately after your provider reviews them. Your provider will discuss the results with you at your follow-up appointment. If you do not have a follow-up appointment, your provider will contact you by letter or phone within five to seven business days.
